### Real Normalization

While the icon of Zionism, Theodor Herzl, dreamt of a "normal" Jewish state, "normalization" does not exist in either law or in diplomacy. Yet Jews are thrilled to hear that Israel's enemies now consider a policy of normalization. That is because Israel's adversaries have conducted a genocidal war throughout Israel's history. A breath of fresh air never hurts.

The Arab League of nations, whose 1945 charter calls for liquidation of the Jews in Palestine, launched a total war in 1948 which continues to this day. In 1964, same goes for the Palestine Liberation Organization, which also issued a charter of total annihilation Jews of Palestine, a covenant in force to this day. Although Egypt and Jordan signed peace treaties with Israel, while Syria and Lebanon did agreed to an armistice with the Jews state, Saudi Arabia, kingpin of the Arab League, has never agreed to any armistice or any peace whatsoever with the Jews.

At the same time, The Palestine Liberation Organization signed a peace with Israel on September 13, 1993, yet the Fatah, the leading entity of the PLO, would not ratify that agreement. Now news reports now have it that the Saudis and the PLO, operating under the nascent Palestinian Authority, are ready to normalize with the Jews.

The time has come to take the Arabs at their word in their call for normalization. However, what would real normalization look like?

Begin with four steps.

1. Remove PA texts & teachers who advocate war against Jews.
2. Rehabilitate seven million Arabs who dwell in 59 "temporary" UNRWA refugees under the false pretense of the "right of return" to pre 1948 villages from 1948 that no longer exist, while facilitating a better life for the UNRWA population. The time has come to remove this roadblock to normal life.
3. Repeal the unprecedented PA law: Murder a Jew, get a salary for life.
4. Remove new PA maps which delete Israel.

These four steps provide the genesis of real normalization between Jews and Arabs. At this point in time, these reasonable steps are not on the agenda of normalization. That does not mean that Jews and Arabs must not try.
